AROUND THE TRAPS

As the winner of the **Australia's Best Tasting Tap Water** in 2017, WIOA has worked with the team from Toowoomba Regional Council and entered the sample from the Mt Kynoch WTP into the Annual Berkeley Springs International Water Tasting competition to be held in the USA in late February. We wish them all the best and hopefully they will bring home gold for Australia.



The **Australian Stockholm Junior Water Prize (ASJWP)** is accepting entries for 2018 with a closing date of 11 March 2018. The ASJWP is an annual water science competition for high school students aged 15 - 20. The winner of the Australian competition, announced at Ozwater'18, goes on to compete internationally at the Stockholm Junior Water Prize during World Water Week in August. The student is awarded a fully-funded trip to Stockholm to participate in a week-long cultural exchange program with national winners from over 33 other nations. Without rain, Cape Town in South Africa, a city of some 4 million people is on the countdown to "day zero" in mid April 2018 where the water supply could be turned off to around 75% of the city. In place of piped water, it is proposed to establish water collection points around the city to ensure the supply of the legally guaranteed minimum of 25 litres per person per day. The social and economic consequences of this action would be enormous. The impact of climate change has hit sooner than anticipated with plans to diversify the water supply with boreholes and desalination plants not due to kick in until after 2020. This case highlights the need for appropriate water supply regulation, planning, security and management. WIOA joins with other Australian water bodies calling for a recommitment to, and renewal of, the National Water Initiative. Australian Industry Standards (AIS) has released their **Water Key Findings Discussion Paper** outlining the challenges, opportunities and skills issues facing the water industry for feedback. The paper aims to provide industry stakeholders a summary of the key findings from recent industry intelligence gathering activities overseen by the Water Industry Reference Committee (IRC) including industry consultations, a survey, and other research activities. The key findings will be used by the IRC to develop the Water IRC Skills Forecast and Proposed Schedule of Work for the National Water Training Package. AIS has been tasked by the IRC to collect feedback to validate and confirm the findings, which will inform the advice the IRC will provide to the Australian Industry and Skills Committee on 30 April 2018.
